First Russian International Jamboree

St. Petersburg, 10–18 August 1994

The basic fee for the camp is \$100 which includes programme, food and internal transport, **NOT** flight to St. Petersburg and return which is about £220 plus £5 for a visa. Additional days are \$14 per day. There will be 2,500 participants, with up to 500 overseas Scouts invited to attend. About 30 activity bases will operate and there will be a special programme for girls.

There is the possibility for home hospitality either before or after the Jamboree. The event can be combined with visiting the Goodwill Games which take place between 23 July and 7 August.

Second Russian Study Trip

Following the success of the last study trip organised in November 1992, it has been suggested that another trip be organised to introduce more Leaders and supporters to Russian scouting. Definite plans have not yet been made, but initial enquiries suggest a price of about £500 for a nine day visit. This will take in St. Petersburg and Moscow with possible side trips to Dubna, Kolomna and Saratov in the newly formed Volga Region. Meetings would be arranged with Federation Troops, Orthodox Scouts and ORUR Troops as well as some time for individual or group sightseeing.

As you probably know our District is hosting a party of Russian Scouts this year.

This was originally planned to take place in August of this year. However, because of the programme already planned by the Kolomna Scouts and their shortage of Leaders, this visit has had to be deferred to the two weeks from 16th. October to 30th. October. They had planned an International Camp with British and American Scouts taking part in August of this year.

However, the Kolomna visit to Stourbridge now seems all set to take place from this Saturday as per our revised plans. We have a busy programme planned for them starting with a Reception on this Sunday afternoon and ending with a Camp Fire on Friday 29th. October.
